**TELECOMMUNICATIONS (COMMERCIAL TRUNKED
RADIOCOMMUNICATIONS NETWORK)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2004**

The Minister in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 110(1) of the *Telecommunications Act*, makes the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Telecommunications (Commercial Trunked Radiocommunications Network) (Amendment) Regulations, 2004*.

2. Regulation 2 of the *Telecommunications (Commercial Trunked Radiocommunications Network) Regulations, 2003* in these Regulations referred to as the principal Regulations, is deleted and the following is substituted:

“2. In these Regulations,

“commercial trunked radiocommunications network”
means the operation of radiocommunications to the
public by means of trunking;

“trunking” means a trunked radio system that allows an
automatic clear channel selection system ensuring the
use of the system by many users at the same time
thereby relieving congestion in the radio spectrum.”.

3. Regulation 3 of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting the word “radiocommunication” and substituting the word “radiocommunications”.

4. Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting paragraph (a) and substituting the following:

S.I. 2003
No. 79. “(a) shall be subject to such conditions as are specified in the licence; and”

5. The principal Regulations are amended by adding immediately after regulation 6 the following Regulations:

“**7.** A licence issued under regulation 3 is valid for the operation of a domestic commercial trunked radiocommunications network only.

8. Any applicant who is desirous of operating a commercial trunked radiocommunications network pursuant to these Regulations shall also complete an application form in respect of an application for:

(a) a spectrum licence;

(b) a service provider licence; and

(c) a network licence.”

6. The Schedule to the principal Regulations is revoked.
